
Day 5 Tokyo-<u>Hakone</u> UNESCO World Heritage Site

Day 7 Kyoto & its many UNESCO World Heritage Sites

- Kyoto guided sight-seeing tour:
 - Tenryu-ji gardenmost famous Zen temple in the area
 - Arashiyama-Sagana Bamboo Forest-Japan's most famous and photographed bamboo grove
 - Kinkaku-ji temple (Golden Pavilion)
 - Kiyomizu Temple- "Pure Water Temple"- It is said that this water possesses the power to extend one's life and fulfill one's wishes.
 - Sannen-zaka & Ninenzaka Streets-The preserved districts of Ninenzaka and Sannen-zaka are two of Kyoto's most attractive lanes, leading from Kiyomizu-dera Temple.
 - Gion Street- filled with shops, restaurants and ochaya (teahouses), where geiko (Kyoto dialect for geisha) and maiko (geiko apprentices) entertain.
