Einstein School enrollment fees include general school and classroom supplies. Some classes, however, require additional fees or student-provided supplies. These items must be purchased by the beginning of the semester.

Refer to your student's schedule and check if there is a class listed below that requires additional supplies. If a class is not listed, then no additional supplies are required. Course content itself is accessed via Canvas. Clubs with fees are also listed (but will not show up on your student's schedule because they are opt-in).

Every Einstein student is required to bring a personal device and charger every day to be successful in class. This personal device must be either a laptop or tablet capable of connecting to the Internet. This device is used to access classwork throughout the day. *Cell phones are not considered personal devices.* While we do not require minimum specs for laptops, Chromebooks are incompatible with many of Einstein's required programs. The device selected must be capable of using the online version of Microsoft. The school does not provide extra chargers or personal devices for student use.

Please be aware that the school does not have lockers or storage areas. Students will take their items, including backpacks, from class to class.

A TI-84 Plus is required for high school math classes (Algebra and above). TI-84 Plus calculators are permitted during SAT and ACT tests, and in collegiate settings. 1) A graphic tablet attached to their computer

2) A recent model iPad with an Apple Pencil

*For virtual learning students in all math classes, a dedicated workspace with a second display surface is recommended. Students can then use one screen to watch and interact with the class and one to see their own work.
