All courses listed above work in Microsoft One Note's "Class Notebook." This means that students do their work on electronic "pages." By doing this, the teacher can observe and check on student progress and supply feedback multiple times during the class. It also provides a seamless class process whether students are in person, online, or any mix within a class period.

Students need one of the following setups starting on the first day of school:

1) A "graphic tablet" attached to their computer. These devices look like a giant mouse pad but have additional capabilities. They are marketed in a wide range of prices as they were originally marketed toward artists. For math we have simpler needs so they can be purchased for \$50 - \$100.

*(Specific recommendations are below under technology recommendations for all students)*

2) A late model iPad with an Apple Pencil. These are expensive, but when used there is usually no need for a laptop to be used in class.

3) A laptop with a quality touch screen, combined with a compatible stylus.

## TECHNOLOGY RECOMMENDATIONS FOR ALL STUDENTS

Every student is required to have a device that connects to the internet, preferably a laptop. Touch screen devices are not required but recommended for use in various classes, as well as a compatible stylus pen. There is no requirement for the brand of device used, however, we have found Chromebooks to be the most problematic for students. Cell phones are not permitted to be used in place of a laptop/tablet. The school does not provide extra chargers or devices for student use.

### Graphic Tablet Recommendations:

We recommend the graphic tablet (option 1). All are compatible with Windows and Apple. Many others will work also. The below is intended to provide an orientation. Comments about Chromebook are included for each:

#### Strongest Recommendation –

- XP-Pen Deco Mini 7 7x4. This tablet is the “little brother” of the XP-Pen Deco1. It is the ideal size for use with a laptop screen. It is also much more convenient to pack and unpack from a backpack every day. It is compatible with Chrome OS 88.0.4324.109 and above. [Link](#)

For virtual learning students: A second display surface is strongly recommended. A dedicated personal workspace or desk is recommended located where there is a strong Wifi connection.
