



2024-25 STUDENT SCHOOL SUPPLY LIST

The Einstein School's enrollment fees include general school and most classroom supplies.

However, some classes require specific supplies and fees, and these items must be purchased by the beginning of the semester.

Please refer to your student's schedule and Canvas page to check if there is a class that requires these additional supplies. If your class is not listed below and there is no notation in Canvas, no additional supplies are required.

Course content is accessed on Canvas. Every Einstein student is required to bring a personal device and charger every day to be successful in class. This personal device must be either a laptop or tablet, which will be used to access classwork throughout the day.

While we do not require minimum specs for a laptop, we do ask that you refrain from Chromebooks, as those cannot fully access all of Einstein's required programs. Your student's device must also be capable of using the online version of Microsoft.

Please note the school does not provide chargers or batteries for personal devices.

Cell phones are not considered a personal device.

Please also be aware that the school does not have lockers or storage areas. Students will take their items, including backpacks, from class to class.

TECHNOLOGY REQUIREMENTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS FOR ALL STUDENTS

Every student is required to have a device that connects to the internet, preferably a laptop.

Touch screen devices are not required but recommended for use in various classes, as well as a compatible stylus pen. There is no requirement for the brand of device used; ***however, Chromebooks are not recommended because they do not provide the required functionality.***

Cell phones are not permitted to be used in place of a laptop/tablet.

The school does not provide batteries or extra chargers or devices for student use.

Graphic Tablet Recommendations:

We recommend a graphic tablet. The ones recommended below are compatible with Windows and Apple, but many others will work also.

Strongest Recommendation:

XP-Pen Deco Mini 7 7x4. This tablet is the “little brother” of the XP-Pen Deco1. It is the ideal size for use with a laptop screen. It is also much more convenient to pack and unpack from a backpack every day. It is compatible with Chrome OS 88.0.4324.109 and above. [Link](#)
